

Keith Prather (MBA) is a managing director of Armada Corporate Intelligence and one of the companies' co-founders. During his 10-plus years as Armada's primary strategist, he has worked with Fortune 500 companies on everything from merger and acquisition strategy to key account management, strategic planning and corporate marketing efforts. He has developed a number of proprietary analytical tools that have been used by companies of all sizes. These include tools designed to position a company in its competitive market, forecasting of competitive movements in an industry sector, identification of the impact of competitive scenarios and strategic optioning for high-level corporate strategy. He has worked with teams to understand supply chain and strategic business activities in key account programs with companies such as Wal-Mart, Honeywell, GE, Toyota, Boeing, U.S. Department of Defense, FEMA and many others. Prather is the chief editor and one of the two primary writers for the Armada Executive Intelligence Brief, as well as for the Armada Industry Intelligence Briefs that have been developed for select industrial sectors. In addition, he contributes to an industry briefing for a major client in the transportation sector hitting more than 400,000 businesses weekly. He has also developed a comprehensive transportation index for a major client in the sector. Prather is also a public speaker for industry associations. He has an M.B.A. with a focused thesis on corporate intelligence and has experience in Asia. He is a former chief financial officer and has an extensive background in data analysis. His family background is in the field of national security, and this exposure informs the style and approach that Armada takes as it seeks to help executives prepare for the challenges they face.

chairman emeritus, Nucor Corp. Dan DiMicco is the retired CEO, chairman and executive chairman of Nucor Corp. He currently holds the honorary title of Chairman Emeritus.

DiMicco joined Nucor Corp. in 1982 as plant metallurgist and manager of quality control for Nucor Steel in Plymouth, Utah, USA, and in January 1988, he became melting and casting manager at the Utah division. In 1991, he became general manager of the Nucor-Yamato joint venture in Blytheville, Ark., USA, and became vice president in 1992. He became executive vice president of Nucor Corp. in 1999, and in 2000 he was elected president and chief executive officer. He served as CEO for more than 12 years, longer than anyone since company founder Ken Iverson. He was elected vice chairman of the board of directors in 2001, and chairman of the board in 2006.

DiMicco was appointed to the United States Manufacturing Council in 2008 by then-U.S. Commerce Secretary Carlos M. Gutierrez, and served on the board until 2011. He also serves on the board of directors for Duke Energy Corp., the National Association of Manufacturers, and the World Steel Association, where he has been a member of the executive committee since 2001.

DiMicco was named to *IndustryWeek* magazine's Manufacturing Hall of Fame in 2011, where he was one of 10 members selected for the year.

Institutional Investor named Dan to the 2012 All-America Executive Team. He received a magazine-ranked, top three "Best CEO" position in the Metals & Mining sector with a second-place finish of all the CEO's in this sector.

The American Institute of Steel Construction (AISC) in January 2012 awarded Dan the prestigious Robert P. Stupp Award for Leadership Excellence.

Prior to joining Nucor Corp., DiMicco was with Republic Steel Corp. in Cleveland, Ohio, USA, as research metallurgist and project leader. He was with Republic Steel from 1975 until he joined Nucor in 1982.

DiMicco graduated from Brown University in Providence, R.I., USA, in 1972 with a B.S. degree in engineering, metallurgy and materials science. He graduated with a M.S. degree in metallurgy and materials science from the University of Pennsylvania in Philadelphia, Pa., USA, in 1975.


