Where did your education and career start?

Why did you choose the steel industry?

I wanted to be part of an industry that really makes a difference. As we all know, the world could not exist without steel, but the cool thing is that steel cannot exist without refractories. what you tell yourself. You also need to be willing to trust those around you — they have been there, likely through similar situations, and they are there to help support and guide you. Finally, be resilient and know that you are strong, smart and capable, and you were chosen for your role for these reasons. You've got this!
